## ALL THE NEWS FROM YOUR PARISH COUNCIL

### Little Aston, Stonnall and Shenstone Neighbourhood Plans

The Parish Council continues to protect and uphold all three of its Neighbourhood Plans. We do this by maintaining a constant watch on both individual applications and area wide planning proposals.

We have successfully objected to individual planning applications that do not compliment the character of our three villages. We have a significant housing application on the edge of Shenstone just over the railway bridge where we need to ensure the design meets the requirements of the Neighbourhood Plan. The outline application has been made for this development and the full application has yet to be made.

We are also active as a Parish Council in contributing to the Lichfield District Council Green Belt Review and have argued successfully to the Examiner that the three Neighbourhood Plans should be in the Examiners words the "appropriate forum" for considering any further housing infill proposals.

We will continue to very closely monitor the Lichfield Green Belt review over the near future as our Parish Council area overall is considered as capable of further housing growth and development.

### Save The Date

It may still be Summer time but we are already thinking about all things festive. Shenstone will be hosting a Christmas market on FRIDAY DECEMBER 13th (we are not a bit superstitious!) from 4.00pm in Main Street, outside the shops. # Cartersfield Lane, Stonnall Speeding Issues

Staffordshire County Council carried out a Traffic Survey of Lichfield Rural South in December 2018 when traffic data from various roads in Stonnall was collated.

The report highlighted that Cartersfield Lane could benefit from traffic calming measures.

This also backs up feedback from local residents and data collected by The Community Speedwatch programme that has recorded vehicles travelling at excessive speeds in that area.

The key recommendation from Staffordshire County Council was for a 40mph speed limit 'buffer zone' to be considered before the 30mph starts on Cartersfield Lane as approached from A461 direction.

The estimated cost of these works is £7,000 but as ever funding for such works is often the key issue to solve.

SCAR (Stonnall Campaign About Roads) had been aware of grants that may be available for such works from the Staffordshire Safer Roads Partnership and a project team put together a comprehensive application for funding.

We are delighted to announce that on behalf of the Village, SCAR has been successful with their application and has received the maximum grant available of £5000.

Councillor David Smith has supported SCAR throughout this application and has agreed to also allocate some County Highways money totalling £2000 so that the total cost of the Buffer Zone in Cartersfield Lane is covered and the works can be completed in the coming months.

All works are being co-ordinated by Staffordshire County Council Highways team so that full and proper programme of activity will be carried out and in the coming months we all hopefully will see that Cartersfield Lane will be a safer road in our village.

## Stonnall Youth & Community Centre

Over the past few weeks, Shenstone Parish Council (SPC) has carried out extensive and lengthy investigations with regard to its position and responsibility in respect of its association with the Stonnall Youth and Community Centre (SYCC) and its Management Committee (MC).

The accumulated, and in many cases newly discovered, documentation and paperwork, which may be viewed by appointment, is in some instances contradictory and in others unclear or confusing.

In summary, it appears that the SYCC MC was formed in or around 1997 by a number of residents and user groups who were concerned that the facility might be closed by its owner, Staffordshire County Council (SCC).

It should be stated that this pre-dates by some 5+ years any involvement of the SPC whatsoever and the MC's formation was approved and accepted by SCC and a formal Licence was agreed and drawn up between the two parties in 2001.

In 2003 SPC entered into a Lease agreement with SCC for the area of land which the building stands on. There is no mention within this Lease of the building's management and it had therefore been assumed that the MC were an autonomous group, approved and licensed by the owners to deal with day-to-day running.

There is mention within paperwork of the

building being offered for sale at £1 but no evidence has come to light as to which, if either party, (SPC or SYCC) completed the conveyance.

Confusion is further exacerbated by the fact that for much of the time of these events, the late Mr J. Mason was Chairman of both SPC and SYCC and it is unclear in some of the papers as to which role he was acting in.

As SPC are in negotiations with SCC in respect of purchasing the entire site, and in an effort to act openly and address fairly the concerns of residents in respect of the management of SYCC, SPC will assume, without prejudice, the role of responsible body and declare that, from this point forward, the SYCC MC are acting on behalf of, and are accountable to, SPC.

In respect of the way forward for the issue of pre-school provision, SPC, in its capacity of Lease holder, will instigate full and independent surveys into two aspects of the building; 1, its structural integrity. 2, its suitability / viability as a pre-school facility. The results of these surveys will be made public in due course.

Should the SPC purchase the whole site, a full public consultation will be held to evaluate its future.

## Stonnall Allotments

The allotments in Stonnall continue to attract new members, 17 in the past 12 months, which

is a 35% turnover. Normally 2-3 plots turn over in a year but as a result of a combination of factors- age, ill health, moving away- the turnover is unusually high.

However, with extensive advertising in the Mercury and local parish magazine, colourful posters throughout the parish, and by sharing our details with Lichfield Allotments waiting list, we have been able to fill all plots except one.

Our focus will be making sure everyone is aware of the allotments and developing a waiting list. Once this happens first priority for plots will go to those that reside within the Parish boundaries.

## Community Grant Funding

The Parish Council will very soon be accepting applications from community groups and organisations seeking funding support. Last year the Council gave over £12,000 in grants for use across the whole Parish for wide & varied uses. These included the purchase of a new hoist for Foottherley Hall, tents for the Aardvark Volunteers in Shenstone, replacement hand dryers for Stonnall Village Hall, replacement & enhancement of the crown in the centre of the green at Little Aston Bowls Club and many others.

## Shenstone Village Festival

We had over 1000 happy visitors, who were spoilt for choice on events to take part in and displays to see. Plus of course an excellent choice of food and drinks to enjoy.

Our many event organisers used the weekend to raise money for their own organisation -The Guides; The Brownies; Rainbows; Shenstone Cares; The W.I. and The FROGS all had a successful day's fundraising. Then there was the Cooper Room and the Library who also benefitted from festival visitors.

Other groups gave money to their favoured charity. These included Cancer Support, Cafod, Mind, Air Ambulance, St Giles Hospice, Lichfield Pathway Project and Dementia Care.

Net income from the sale of programmes was just over £4000 which was an all time record for the festival. This money will be made available to Shenstone-based community organisations by way of small, one-off grants. Please mail Keith Jones on solvac@btinternet for an application form.

## Friends of Shenstone Tower



You may well have heard that Heritage England are considering whether or not they should allocate funding to renovate the Grade2\* listed old church tower. It is a building of considerable historic interest and is currently classified as being 'at risk'.

A small group of interested parties, including representatives from Heritage England, the Parish Council, St John's Church and the local community, have so far attended three meetings to discuss the project. A survey of the tower has been completed and plans drawn up for the restoration.

Several ideas about how the tower might be used in the future have also been proposed and include its use as a viewing platform (views are spectacular), as a venue for wedding photographs, as a permanent exhibition space for the local history of Shenstone and even as a telecommunications tower.

To be sure of getting support from Heritage England it is vital that the community gets behind the restoration and contributes ideas/suggestions about how the restored tower can be used in the future. To this end a group has been formed "Friends of Shenstone Tower" to take this project forward & raise the remaining funds. There is a lot to do but pledges have already been received amounting to around £7,000 plus the support from the Parish Council.

During the summer term, all of the year 6 pupils at St. Peter's and Little Aston Primary School, a total of 63 pupils, have completed the Staffordshire Police Junior Cadets programme. As the Greysbrooke Primary School and Shenstone Lodge pupils embarked on the course in the autumn term, it means that all of the year 6 pupils in all our primary schools have had this wonderful opportunity to engage in a meaningful way with the Police and grow in their knowledge and understanding of their role in the community and their understanding of good citizenship. Throughout the course, there is a constant emphasis on the importance of respecting themselves, their neighbours, their community and the environment. It has been a real joy working with our young people; they are so full of life, energy and have immense potential.

## Changes to Burial Regulations Shenstone Lower Lawn Cemetery

For some time now the Parish Council has been looking at possible sites for the development of a new cemetery. Based on projected use, without changes to how we plan and use the existing land, we will reach capacity in five years. Investigations into a new site have so far proved unsuccessful.

Therefore, after lengthy discussions with Mark Ridgeway who is the grave digger for Shenstone & Stonnall, and a meeting of the Parish Council, it was agreed that a new approach is required. Initially this will be reducing the spacing between cremation plots. There are no legal guidelines as to how close plots should be but our plot spacing is over generous. By closing the gap between plots we would increase capacity to fifteen years. This was approved by Council and will come into effect once the existing row is complete. Appropriate space will be retained between plots to enable strimming and to, of course, maintain a respectful distance.

Currently the Lower Lawn Cemetery is in two halves, burials on one side and cremated remains on the other. On the burials side, there are large areas of ground which could easily be used for cremated remains. It was agreed that, once the cremated remains section is full, the land on the burial side will start to be utilised generating another ten years.

Regulations already state that only residents of Shenstone or anyone with a close personal connection to the village may be interred there and plots may not be pre purchased.
